APT TRAINING CENTER COMPLETES 2ND YEAR

HICKSVILLE—APT Manufacturing Solutions completed its 2nd year of the Manufacturing Training Center. 8 students from Hicksville and Fairview High School, 5 seniors and 3 juniors, completed their requirements at the training center, located in the APT plant and instructed by APT employees.

Throughout the school year, the students spent 2 hours per day at APT facilities, logging hours on various skilled tasks with APT employees as instructors. The students worked "hands-on" in every area of our machining, fabrication, and automation divisions. They completed their capstone project of designing, fabricating, assembling, wiring, and programming a robot packing cell that placed pill bottles into an organized pattern inside a box, using one of the 2 FANUC robots the Training Center supplies exclusively for students.

Out of the 5 seniors, 4 were selected for summer internships in their career fields. Those students in internships are competing for a limited number of full-time employment apprenticeships APT will be offering in the fall. Summer internships typically pay between \$4,000-\$8,500, and the first year apprenticeships offer full time benefits, free college, and pay around \$30,000-\$45,000. The interns not selected for apprenticeships will attend college in the fall and plan to return annually to round out the "hands-on" portion of their resumes.

There are 2 students returning in the 2017-18 school year. 2nd year students select an area of interest from their first year and APT focuses on helping them be "work-ready" by the end of the 2nd year.

6 new students (4 from Hicksville and 2 from Fairview) have earned spots in the program for 2017-18. Those new students were selected from over 100 interested students and earned their place based on academic prowess, teacher recommendation, a written application, and a demanding panel interview with APT team leads and executives from every department in the company.
